As we are gathering resources and meeting new people, it is with great reverence that we acknowledge and lift up those who are alone, unseen and who are crying for help but are struggling to be heard.

We earnestly ask friends, family, colleagues and associates to contact us if you know of someone or organization who would like to participate in this documentary film because they are just as impassioned as we are, they want to expose domestic violence but more acutely, protect and provide the healing that best serves the DV survivor.
